Description:

This Longton Hall porcelain mug is decorated with a print entitled "Major General Wolfe", with rococo scrollwork to either side, surmounted by trophies of arms, funeral monuments and flags. Two flags on the left are inscribed with the names "Louisbourg" and "Quebec", two of Wolfe's victories in North America during the Seven Years War. He was fatally wounded at the latter battle in 1759. The printing was carried *expand* [+]
