Description:

This tea bowl is an example of the very rare group of bone ash softpaste porcelain, made by John Bartlam at Cain Hoy near Charleston between c1765-69. This is now recognised as the first porcelain to have been produced in America. Bartlam had left Staffordshire about 1763 to travel to Charleston with the object of setting up a pottery. Shards of porcelain excavated at Cain
