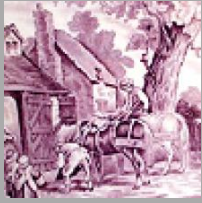

Portions of the border pattern are quite blurred on this example. Prior to discovery of the source prints that Clews used for these patterns, researchers David and Linda Arman endeavored to provide descriptive names
