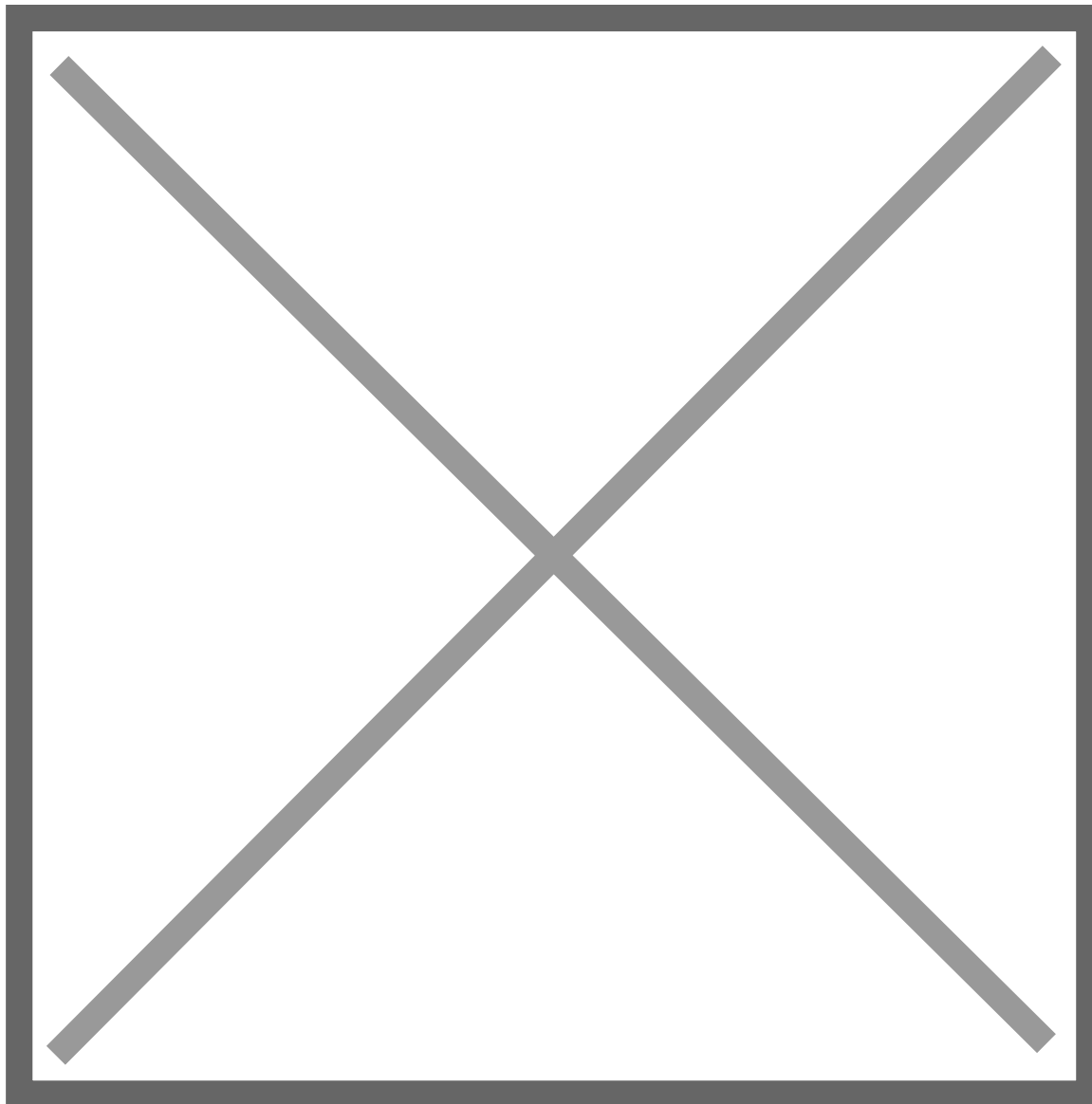

Dust-pressed earthenware tile printed in brown from a set of six tiles with scenes from Little Red Riding Hood. Probably designed by Thomas Allen, formerly at Mintons, and by 1876, at Wedgwood, where he became chief designer and then Art Director.
