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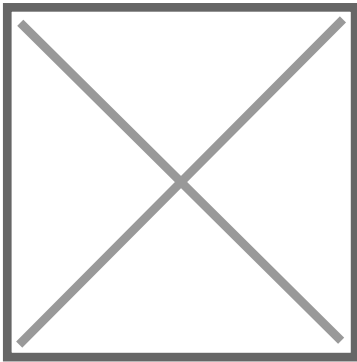

A pearlware tray with elegantly molded leaf-shaped handles, printed with a line engraved version of the Two Figures II pattern which is based on a Chinese original export porcelain design.
