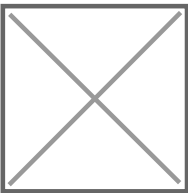

This earthenware plate, printed in brown with a view of City Hall, New York from the American Scenery Series contains, inserted into the upper-center border, a medallion honoring the 6th Regiment of the U.S. Infantry. The regiment, formed in 1812 and known as “The Regulars,” was led by Zachary Taylor, who later became the twelfth President of the United States. The group motto, “Regulars,
