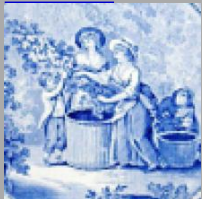

A painted enamel inscription is found below the central pattern "JOHN & SARAH ARTIS, YARMOUTH, 1769". A possible attribution to Sadler as the printer has been suggested, given that this same pattern is *expand* [+]

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
