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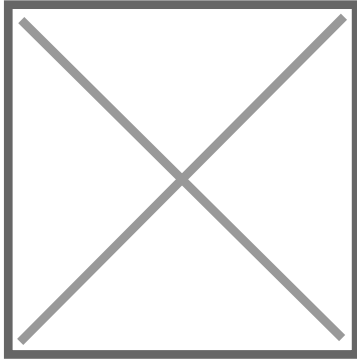

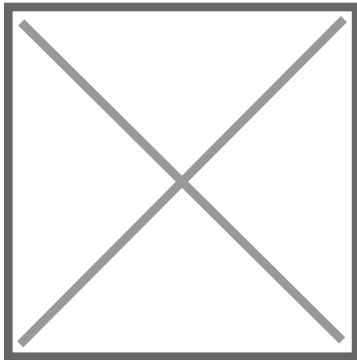

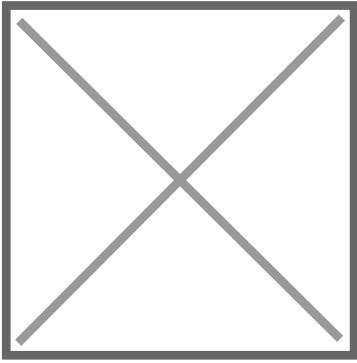

A rare earthenware cheese wheel, or cradle, printed in blue with two line-engraved versions of the Buffalo pattern. Spode's Type B is printed on the sides and in the interior. A second version of the Buffalo pattern, Feathered Hats, is printed on the ends of the piece. This example is not marked but, due to its shape and the characteristics of the patterns
