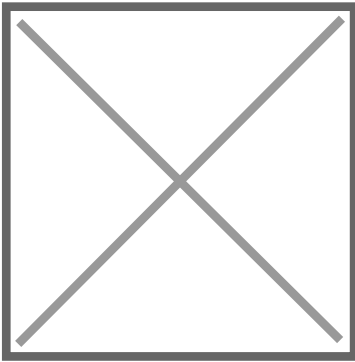

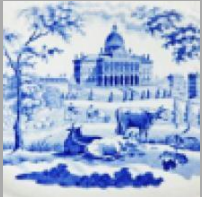
to a design by Decimus Burton (1800-81). It was demolished in 1875. This example is unmarked.
