The source print, Martin & Weasel, is from *A Cabinet Of Quadrupeds* by John Church, 1805. The artist is Julius Caesar Ibbetson and the engraver is James Tookey. Notice that only the weasel and the rabbit (the weasel's prey) were used on the pottery.

## Description:

An earthenware handled dish printed in blue with the Weasel pattern. It is also known as Weasel and Rabbit or Hare. The border consists of stylized leaves and flowers against a diamond or crosshatch background. The pattern is also found in a border cartouche on the Polar Bear vegetable tureen and the inside of a fruit or chestnut basket (seen below).
