This earthenware plate is printed, in pink, with the image of View near Conway, N. Hampshire, on the same shape employed for the Holy Bible Series by the same potter, Job and John Jackson. The small plate pattern is identical in every other detail of the American Scenery Series pieces. The plate has only an impressed worker's mark.

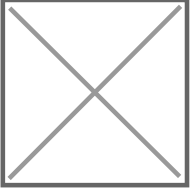

Description:

An earthenware cup plate printed in purple with View near Conway, N. Hampshire, from the American Scenery Series. Although the number of rose sprays has been lowered from six to five, together the view and the full border fill the surface of this diminutive cup plate. The series was printed in black, light blue, brown, green, pink and purple.
