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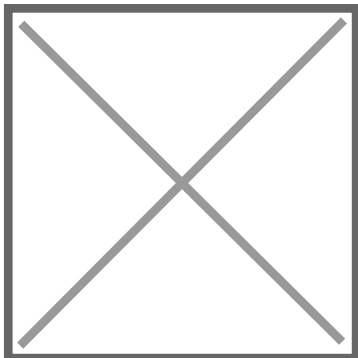
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A top down view of both the shoe and the lid. The lid fits in the shoe with a short flange. The pin-pointed pattern on the top of the lid does not pierce all the way through, probably added for decorative purposes only.

Two handles or lugs are found on the top of the lid.



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One of the unusual aspects of this piece is the animal or sporting pattern printed on the sole of the shoe providing notable contrast with the chintz-floral design printed on the shoe and lid. The initials "R K", also printed in green, suggest that this was a made-for-order item.
