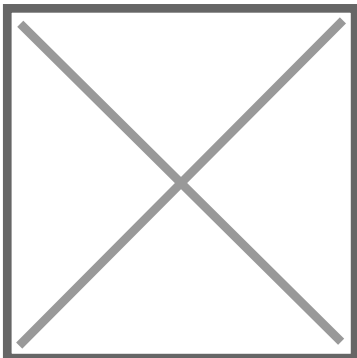
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The same print was used twice on the body of the mug. Its shape suggests it was designed for the well of a round

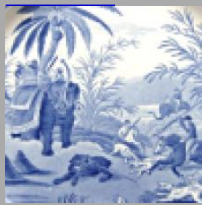
