Earthenware wine cooler printed in blue with the Willow I pattern. The cooler consists of an outer and inner vessel designed to cool wine in a bottle. Ice would be placed in the outer area to keep the wine chilled. The inner vessel held the bottle. By not coming in direct contact with the ice, the bottle would remain dry and could be easily

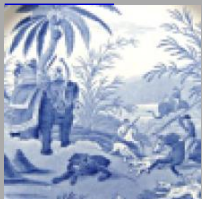
