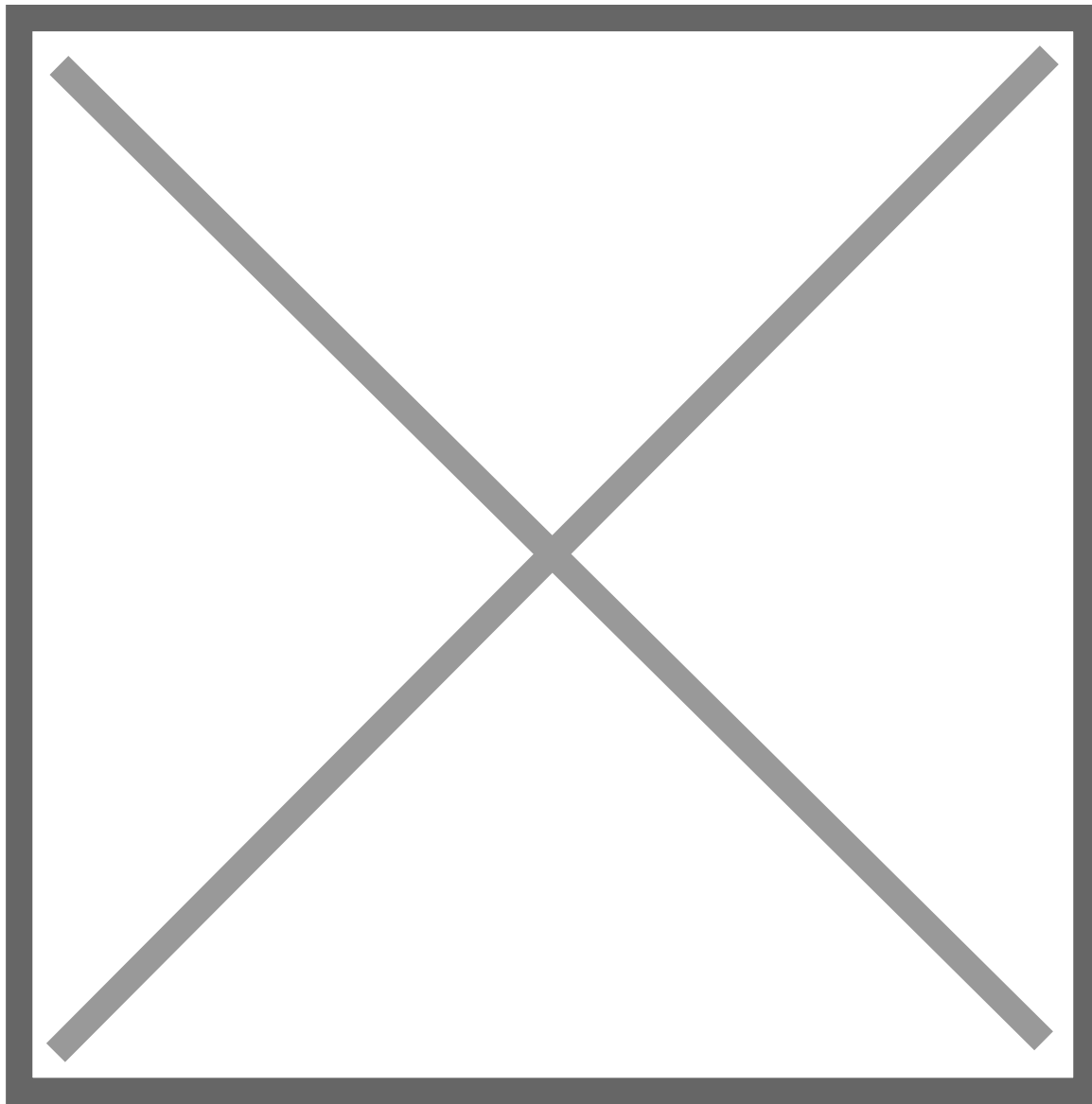


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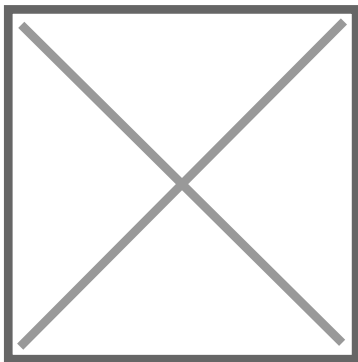

Printing in a single color on earthenware and stoneware 1780-1820

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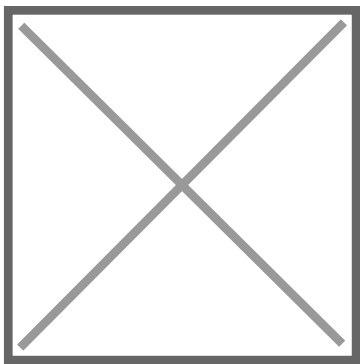

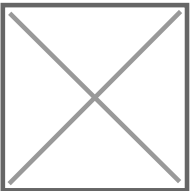

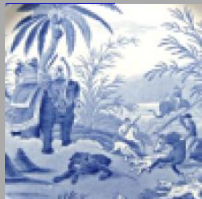
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
