



A large earthenware milk pail printed with the Standard Willow pattern. Two pairs of birds were used to fill the space on both sides of the words "PURE MILK" which have been hand painted on the piece. It has molded and decoratively painted handles. The large container is covered with a brass hinged-lid under which hangs a brass plunger. When the lid was raised *expand* [+]
