




Description:

Plate, patent ironstone china, decorated with an underglaze blue printed pattern known to collectors as Turner's Willow. The reverse has the mark Turner's-Patent hand painted in blue. William and John Turner were issued a patent for the production of ironstone china in January 1800 but by 1806 the brothers were declared bankrupt, leaving a very short time frame for production of their ironstone wares.
