




## **Description:**


Bone china dish of ornate molded form. The decoration is a sheet pattern printed in green and enlivened with gilding. The mark on the back refers to Machin & Potts patent method of printing. The patent was taken out in September 1831 by John and William Wainwright Potts, who adapted a textile process and used engraved cylinders or rollers, to produce a continuous stream *expand* [+]
