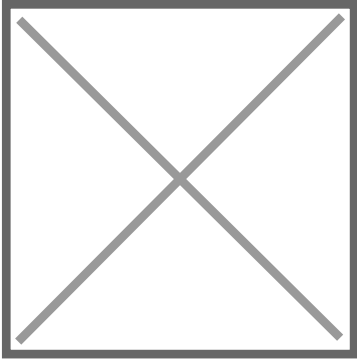

### **Description:**

This small bell-shaped mug is of the so-called Baddeley-Littler group of porcelain. It is decorated with a blue enamel dentil rim and a black enamel print of a lady and a small girl walking hand in hand with a boy standing nearby. A similar print is recorded on creamware. This mug was in the Bernard Watney collection, who identified the source of the print as
