





Description:

This porcellanous tureen, with twisted handles and standing on three feet, was almost certainly made at the Cockpit Hill Pot Works in Derby. Cockpit Hill was mainly a producer of creamware and stoneware but, as is shown by a 1780 advertisement for the selling up of its stock in trade, it also produced porcelain. John Heath was a partner in both Cockpit Hill and the main *expand* [+]
