

Description:

Creamware mug printed in black, made by John Warburton at Carr's Hill Pottery, Gateshead, and probably printed at the factory since 'J Warburton N C Tyne' is the printed, and only, mark. NC stands for Newcastle. Gateshead is on the south bank of the River Tyne, but John Warburton also had a shop on the Quayside from at least 1770. Newcastle, on the north bank *expand* [+]


